1. **Call to Order**: Knizacky called the meeting to order at 11:00 AM.

2. Limited Public Comment: None.

3. Approval of the Agenda: Motion by Nash, supported by Pepper; motion carried 4-0-0.

4. Approval of the Meeting Minutes from 8-29-2022: Motion by Quillan, supported by Nash; Motion carried 4-0-0.

5. Committee Business

- a. Correspondence: None
- b. Number of administrative appeals for under 9 credits since last meeting: None noted.
- c. Consideration of Student Appeals
 - i. Appeal #57: Under 9 Credits: Motion by Quillan to recommend approval to the full Board, with support from Nash; Motion carried 4-0-0.
 - ii. Appeal #58: High School GPA under 2.0: Motion by Nash to recommend approval to the full Board, with support from Pepper; Discussion about whether the 2.0 removal was retroactive, which it was not; motion carried 4-0-0.
 - iii. Appeal #59: Under 9 Credits: Motion by Pepper to recommend approval to the full Board, with support from Nash; Motion carried 4-0-0.
 - iv. Appeal #60: Under 9 Credits: Motion by Nash to recommend approval to the full Board, with support from Knizacky; Nash added that he feels it is important to give students a chance; Motion carried 3-1-0.
 - v. Appeal #61: Minimum GPA: Motion by Quillan to recommend approval to the full Board, with support from Nash; Motion carried 4-0-0.
 - vi. Appeal #62: Minimum GPA: Motion by Quillan to recommend approval to the full Baord, with support from Nash; Motion carried 4-0-0.
- d. Residency for McKinney-Vento Students: Students classified under the McKinney-Vento act are recognized in both K-12 and higher education as being homeless or without a fixed residence. These students may not have an address, or may have an address that represents a location that is not where they are living. Can students who schools verify as having McKinney-Vento status be considered Mason County residents if they graduate from a Mason County-based public school district, for the purposes of receiving the Mason County Promise?
 - Motion by Knizacky to get an opinion from the state to see if McKinney-Vento students from Mason
 County schools are eliqible for the Promise, and to recommend that the Promise do a plan amendment to



allow McKinney-Vento graduates from Mason County to use the Promise, if necessary, with support form Nash; Motion carried 4-0-0.

- 6. Any Other Business: Maloney sought clarification to see if the committee would like to continue requiring students who are below a 2.0 at renewal to appeal for the scholarship if they are not required to do a SAP appeal due to warning status. The consensus was to keep the appeal requirement as-is, with no action taken.
